Here Miss D. felt unwell and "rs F. brought out an open bottle of bay-rum for her to drink. Compromised by bathing D's head with it fter which she returned to car. M rs F. spoke to a man passing on road and said it was Mr randison, her brother, whose house we had just visited. She called him to come and meet us. Though hurrying to his ground he came and w s very co-operative. Agreed with what his sister told himshe had just told us. Left for his ground. Interruption cause by a cow followed by a man on a mule stampedi; through their cultivations around the house. Mrs F. ca lled out to man beggin him to keep the cow off the wams which were just planted. She and other woman ran tohead off cow. Man on mul warned it was a bad cow. It did stampede through the yam hills. Taken with resignation. Eventually headed back on to road. Very co-operative. Interests more social and less personal than usually found. Met heragain at IrisFacey (q.v.).
