Returned to Cuba where he likes better. He works there on fields. He writes to Clifton, who had a letter from him recently. Melvin says he will look for work for Clifton in Cuba. If one wants g to Cuba he must have somebody there to vouch for him. He would travel by air. It costs L 8. It is quicker than by boat /?/ uba is 90 miles away. Clifton would like to go to the U.S.A. But he did not get the tickeć. Mrs. Brisset distributes tickets. He was in the fields when she distributed them and did not get one/?/ Some people go to Panama, where they work in the fields. It is more like in America, they make money there. Clifton would like also to go to Kingston. He left school two years ago. He works in the fields.
