Now I take escellion, sugar head and such to Stewart Town, no market not there, is just a little village and I use the beast. I have to buy these things sometimes and sell them over. I used to go to Balackva market but Lowland suit me better. The speculator come same place here and buy the yam, when I not going to market.

House: It put up long, long time ago, all the children born right here. Since I live here we have about 4 different houses on the same spot.

Grand children: Ellen has I daughter Phyllis Clarke, the father Hazel Clarke has not given anything # towards her support for about 6 months.

There are several grandchildren, but I visited them twice but was unable to get much information concerning them.
