Tannery.

He did not sell his agreultural produce. "Only plant what to eat, that time had me own tannery doing business. I give up Alligator Pond tannery and was doing a small busines down here, but if you don' have plenty water you can' manage a good size tannery. Water supply is short. We go on with it (himself and his sons) like a company like, you k know. We use pond water, sometime we buy water from Junction.tank.

Land.

When he came to Bull Savanah he bought 6 acres of land. He bought 4 more in Thatch Walk. He bought the land £8 per acre. Charlie did not want to talk at all about his land, I believe he owns more than 10 acres. "You must be after something else."

I met Nellie - Charlie's grand daughter at Myrtle Thompson' home she took me over to see her grand rather. Nellie is a about 4 years old. Charles was working in the field. I told him he could continue his work while we talked. He said he could not work during the conversation as that would not be etiquette. Me not have little discipline bot me. Asked what he did after he left school. "Wonder about parents'homr till a move out." He was not a lazy child. aziness is something like sloth, and the Bible say, the sloth think hard to raise his hand to his mouth. So, you see, if you lazy, you can' get anything."

Jamaica people age not lazy, and St. Elizabeth people have to work hard, them don' have produce here like some parishe that have pimento and coffee. Them have to make a pay day for themself."

Asked if he kept to one woman now. "You see when you get shaky, you have to keep to one. Is like when you go to set and bad weather take you, you have to come back ashore, we is me now, I have to keep to one."

Why did father give up business "Theives break the shop and take out partly everything. Storm come blow off the top, so him jus' give it up, couldn' pay."

We has 5 acres of land at New Forrest and 4 at Ballard's Valley. He bought the 4 acres from Marie Gordon. He is going to build his house at Ballard's Valley. Dudley also works on his father's land. Charles pays taxes for all the land. (not including Dudley's own)

David, Charles and Rudolph, children of Johny and Fanny Thompson operate tannery. Johny was one of Charles brother; and Fanny a sister of Mrs. Thompson. Johny came to Bull Savannah to "spend time" He took sick and died here. He was buried at David's place. Fanny died a few months ago at Plowden, Manchester. Johny met his wife here, and tobl her back to Manchester with him. "Is 3 brother, married 3 sister."

"After that I went to Montego Bay. to deLisser's garage.
That time me father vex with me for I would not work on the trade." He worked in Montego Bay for 2 years as a mechanic "I leave that, and check out, and go over to the welding at Mandeville. "He remained there 1 year. Marshall, who was working at the same place, left and went to Goat Island, and he got a job at Goat Island for Dudley. He stayed there for 2 years.

"Come back home, stayed ofor a few months and wwent to America '44 Stayed there 9 months." After remaining at home for a few months he went back to America in '45 and stayed for"1 year and 3 months." Westmorland is suffering now from hard times. "And is a parish that get constant rainfall." Food has to be sent from other parishes to Westmorland.

Charles said money was left to the negros by Queen Victoria "The higher ones them use it up. The poor don' get a thing."

Water Supply.

Both Leslie and Charlie feel that Bull Savannah should have a Parish tank. Leslie said they wanted to get the water from New Forrest by laying pipes. "But that won' do for now. Better them just make the tank."
