"We had an accident last June. A young boy, a very fine boy, he disappeared. He was Wilfred Rocchester. He went down the river to catch crabs. He dont come back until to-day. Young boy. We had a talk that he was caught by the alligator."

"All of us we went down. We went up the river in boats, and we searched and we dived. Nothing was found. We had iron hooks, plenty iron hooks, make and we draught it and we searched in the mangrove swamp and in the river, in many places, and no sign of him."

"Them dug the sand, put him without analytimax the coffin, naked body covered with coconut leaves. A few weeks the river turn herself in the same position and took him out."

I paid a visit to the house, which looked empty. This is an old house - kigx fairly big, but one roome only. The roof looks delapidated and the house hankunkidy wand looks as if inhabitable. There is no garden and no cultivations around the house. There was nobody in the house but I noticed somebody in the kitche. Vernice Petkins was sitting behind the kitchen facting k nursing her 9 months old baby. Her 3 years old Olive was besides her: a bowl with some cooked food was on the ground, but the brakfast seemed to be over. In the kitchen I noticed Emmily Rochester - she was wankin busy at the kitchen fire. Crafton and Panton Rochester warexware joined as a few whiles later - they were working near-by preparing stones to be taken by the Company truck.

Family history.

Crafton, Panton and Emmily are full brothers and sisters. Their father was Armold Rochester, son of old Artur Rochester. Their mother wax is Agnes yer. Their mother did not marry their father. She lives now in Ridge with one of the daughters. Their father died about one year ago after the death of their brother Whilfred. For other particulars of their family history see: Family Record of their mother, Agnes Dyer, No 123.

Crafton kasks started to live with Vernice Perkins in 1940 but only after the death of his father he took her to his home. Before that he was along with another woman she was Vernice Powell from Comma Pen. He had a daughter with Vernice Powell. She stayed with the mother. Vernice Powell after she had chilld for him married another man a Cane, also in Vomma Pen. His daughter is now about 15.

Vernice Perkins is daughter of Eli Perkins and Ethel Perkins. Her family live in Thatch Walk. For further particulars see Fam. Mix Rec. 11.

Panton is not married. Has no girl friend.

Emmily Rochester, Panton's and Crafton's dam sister,

is single. She had two children: one for Eustace & ricksphark knakkikkekk Elliott, son of Alice Heath in Thatch Walk. The boy, Lester, who is now ab.18 years old, stays with his grandmother. Another child, Mavis Holness, 8 years old, stays withnthe mother. Mavis is not sent to school. Her father is Kennedy Holness, favourite son of Theodore Holness in Ribbit Town.

"slow in speech", brsides both brothers hurried to return to their work at stones. Factory is collecting now stones to build new buildings. They pay 8/- for a truck load. Everybody regards it as a good bargain and so all Bottom Savannah was busy with breaking, carrying, heaping and loading stones on the kex truck which was coming to their place now and again.

Panton and Crafton are cultivators. They do not work for anybody else and dont practice any special trade. Their homestead is very poor. There is no tank at their yard and they get water from their neighbours, chiefly from Uncle Moses. 3 mangos are all their fruit trees. Their cultivations last year: 3000 holes of tomatoes, L30. 36 yam hills. Cassava ab. 1 acre. 1/4 ac. corn. Some sweet potatoes. 1 sheep.

Their land: 1,5 acre homeland around the house. This they inherited from their father, who again got it from his father Arthur. All the land ar und belonged to Rochesters and they are

surrounded by other Rochesters, thear relatives.

They have also 4,75 acres in Duff House - inherited from their father. Their cultivations are both here and in Duff House. This was said to explain to me why there are so few cultivations around the house.

Their plans. Both Crafton and Panton told me that they plan in near future to build separate house for themselves. Crafton is going to builf his house in Duff House - the place they call .ruinate", where other people from B.B.S. move now. Panton plans to build his house nearby on the old home-land. This is the reason why they do not repair the old house. This house with kkerkandrandmarkate a portion of land around itw will be left to Emmily who will live her alone. As she is rather incapable /"not so collective"/ they will support her abyhow.

H bert Moses Elliott's commentary. I asked Uncle Moses on my way back about this family. ExarkanxendxRantan Both brothers - according to Uncle Moses - are poor cultivators. Wilfred, who was drowned last year, was the only one that knew how to work. He was chief support to the family. Panton and Crafton are no good. Their plans of building new houses for themselves are known to their neighbours. Crafton is building hew house already for 7 years. It was seven years ago that he bought lumber for this purpose. Panton only plans, but does nothing about brilding his new home.
