James Powell. His parents.

Minamitera Rosea Romedia James Powell is son of Ellis Powell and grandson of George Powell. His mother "Birdie"Powell is still alive; his father died a couple of years ago. /Cf.FamRec.107/. He is a cultivator and owns a shop - lives just besides the shop.

He is also a cultivator. Exxim Belongs to Jehovah Witnesses and plays an important part in the society. Is described as the secretary and all correspondence with the headquarters and with other branches is in his charge.

The shed which serves ehovah Witnesses as their meeting house, is built on his generalizately yard. He got his land from his late father.

His wife: Rose Powell.

He married some 8 or 10 mars years ago Rose Powell, Michael Powell's daughter. They have not got many children. Just two or three.

His girl friend Eva byer.

Before he married Rose Powell, he was in friendship with another girl, Eva Dyer. He got two children by han Eva Dyer: Aubrey and Vinell. They wand stayed with their granparents: Ellis and "birdie" powell. Eva Dyer is Bradley Dyer's sister. /See Fam. Rec. 107/.

Visit at home. Interv. James & Rose Powell. 10.7.48. and 19.6.48.

It's for the second time I went to interview this family and both times the interview was ruined by Boysie Roach who is the chief "publisher" of Jehovah Witness doctrine in Bull-Savannah. Whatever the beginning of the conversation in less than one minute Boysie Roach shifts to the Theocratic Government principles - and he won't let talk anybody else and on nothing else. I am afraid I won't be one of his converts. The more I hear him the less I like the idea of his denomination, as it seems to me that it hinders to a greater extent than any other denominations any attempts of social organisation which is so needed in this country. It is in principle against any made "government"

The place of James Powell is the centre of the Jehovah Witness activities. There are two sheds: one knik smaller built two years ago for the purpose of serving as a meeting house for the Jehovites. This year a much bigger shed has been erected on the other side of the house. This will be made into a proper house with walls and doors and is the big ger meeting house, as the old proved to be too small for the numerous followers.

James Powell his brother Joseph Powell and cousin Vincent Powell (living in neighbouring houses) are staunch supporters and chief organisers of the Jeh. Witn. in Bull-av. Boysie Roach is the personnification of the atomic energy giving the impetus to the activities of this society.

Present household.

Boysie Roach will soon have to remove from Vincent Powell's new house. Vincent is getting married in a few days and needs the house for himself. Boysie probably will stay with his mother in Ridge but will be still boarding with James Powell.

The house. There are two rooms in the main house. Two more rooms are in the building in which the shop is. so 4 rooms are used ase living quareters. The shop consists of one room in front of the building. The kitchen is in a separate building. On each side of the living house there is one shed! the old and the new meeting house of the J.W. The shop is rented by James to his brother Joseph.

James Powell is the son of Ellis Powell/grand-son of George Powell. His father is dead. His mother Birdie Powell lives nearby with her only daughter Lilian. (sister of James) Sames has two brothers: Joseph lives in the next house lower down the hill and teslie left Bull-Savannah and

lives in Prospect.

James learned shoemaking and thaught this trade to his brother and cousin. He is doing shoemaking now in addition to was cultivatings.

His two outside sons with Eva Dyer are staying now with

him. Bya Dyer died.

Rose Powell his wife is the daughter of Michael and Margaret Powell, who live very near at the bottom of the small valley. She was one of 13 children (counting also the half brothers and sisters). For particulars see F.R. 126.

Children Rose had only 3 children with James. They live with the parents. James had 2 outside children - also living in this household. I saw the three younger ones. They are pleasant children. Both the mother and the father watch them and admonish sweetly but firmly At my first visit Novely was helping to shell the french beans. She is "in the first book" at school. She annvaunt was playing at my second visit at counting the spokes in a bicycle wheel. She went as far as 27 but stopped when she realized I was watching her. Novely has two god-mothers (one god-father) as it is the custom here. Rose explained to me that the custom is really not local but it is required by the parson. The godparents have to join the church and this is the way the parson gets members of his church. "All that it is politics".

Adelie Simpson is from Rose Hall. She is a kind of servant in this household. I haven't seen her. Her parents brothers and sisters live in Rose Hall.

Boysie Roach. I met him on many occasions and he paid several visits to us. He is from the Roach family from Ridge His parents are Michael and Ida Roach. Michael is a brother of Thomas Roach (father of Mrs. Marion wife of Isaac Johnson) Boysie has 5 brothers and 4 sisters. He said he couldn't con vert any of them to his doctrine.

Boysie is working in the factory. During the season he

was the manager of the packing house.



Boysie Roach hasn't seen "the true light" at once. During his life time he belonged already to three denominations. (He himself doesn't like to talk about it and it is certainly not easy to induce him to talk about what he doesn't like or to stop him talking about what he likes. Careful as I was I didn't succeed in keeping out of the religious problems. The moment Roach appeared joining James, Rosse Powell, their children and myself I found him standing in front of me with his bright big black eyes sparkling with fervour and white teeth (one in front is missing) flashing in front of my dazed eyes. He has a tremendous facility of speaking, or rather of pouring out quotations from the Bible and sentences from his Jeh.publications. Much as I tried I never could see any sense in it, sounds to me pure scholastic and reminds very much of other "publishers" of a secular but better known doctrine, whom I had the opportunity of hearing frequently in the max past years.

Boysie Roach seems to me worked by a great emotional problem. All tax others of his fellow-believers - the most important of whom were present at this particular interview - were quiet and I spoke with them on many occasions about other matters without them bringing their doctrine into conversation. Boysie is very dark as compared with his associates. He is not married. Has no house and no land

of his own. It seems to me he never acts naturally.

I shall not relate the particular subject of his ser mon as there are long interviews with them on the subject in File 7 (Religion). There is only one interesting point to be added.

The main secular aspect of the J.W. doctrine is the absolute condemnation of war and government. In fact wars are the result of "man made" governments. The government should rest exclusively with God. "We are against the demo cratic government, the totalitarian government, the aristocratic government, the only government is the theocratic government." I avoided to argue with him on the basis of Bible but tried some arguments of secular and concrete type.

Government. The J. Wit. don't vote on the principle that those who govern have to be appointed by God and not

sent by men.

Q. "Are you an active officer of the Growers Association?" Yes he is. He does tell people what to do etc. But this is not a government. It is concerned with planting, the plants grow by the will of God.

Q."Suppose all the inhabitants of amaica become J.W. would you vote then?" Mr. Roach thinks there wouldn't be any need for a government. I said there would be still need of somebody who would look farx after the management of problems concerning all the nation. For instance the

care of the health, where to built hospitals etc. It seems I have chosen a wrong example. Mr. Boysie is sure there will be no need of hospitals. "hen everybody in Jamaica is J.W. "Nebody will say 'hm' from pain". It seemed to me something of a mirable. But suppose I said a stone dropps on your head. No, when everybody is J.W. no stone can harm any head.

They don't vote. "Suppose you are a Polish Ambassador in Germany would you vote?" He asked me. No I wouldn't vote because it is not my country. Well that is the reason J.W. don't vote, they are ambassadors of another govern-

ment here on Earth.

The war Boysie considers the greatest calamity of minkind. This war started with "ermany wanting a part of Polish territory. Why Poland didn't give them, it would present have prevented this war. He looked at me with pity and amazement when I told him that in my opinion some type of life might be worse than death. No he wouldn't mix in any type of social strife. He agees slavery was a bad thing, but he wouldn't fight against it. "You can be a Christian even when you are a slave." And if he belonged to slave owners - were born as the son of a slave owner. "I would leave the place and stay away."

He made a point of it that they are not seditionists, but just don't want to have anything to do with governments. They only try to bring the theocratic government But how it would work here he wasn't concerned. God would

see to 1t.

The only principle of their religion I liked was the abstention from smoking and drinking. It is not a binding rule and they don't condemn anybody who smokes or drinks. For instance vincent dmokes. But as it does no good neither to the body nor to the pocket they try not to do it. With the exception of vincent none of the accepted the cigarettes I offered. Ausuphavenerally were vigarettes

It was getting late and finally I manage to tear myself from Boysie Roach. He repeated several times that when I get home I should read a certain paragraph of the book "Let the God be true" which is published by the Watch Tower. (I bought the book for my collection). "This will help you, this will make you good." At parting I teld him that if ever he stands for elections and I will be in a position to vote, I will vote for him. All the men laughed. I believe Boysie liked the compliment too. He even forgot to repeat that I should read the paragraph on theocratic government. I left the group of people behind the shop laughing.

Means of subsistence of James Powell. He has a acre of home land round the house which he got from his father who got it from in turn from his father George Powell. James bought 6 acres in Duff House from the settlement at the beginning of war. It provides the family with "food kind" He is not satisfied with his tomato crop this year, though it was exceptionnaly good for almost everybody in B. Sav.

The building in which the shop is belongs to James. Te rents it to his brother Joseph. Sames himself does shoe making i.e. repairs. He says the money he gets for it doesn't gover even half of the cash expenditure for the

household. In fact it is much less.

Thear boarder Boysie Roach pays for his meals in cash. "Charge him modest." but he didn't tell how much. It

is more a friendly service than business.

Rosy works during the season in the factory.
On Sundays James goes publishing from house to house. I met him on such occasion last Sunday at Cornelious Powell house.

On the whole this household seems well off. The two brothers and cousin 'incent sems to live in close friendship, they can be found very often in the smaller shed, talking or doing some work together.

I had another try at Mr. James Powell home. But we didn't have the chance of talking for more than five minutes when Boysie Roach emerged from the house, so I hurriedly went away.

Sames Powell learnt shoemaking from "an old man Gordon. He was from Junction. Was for a time in Bull-Saynnah but left the district and went to Christiana." Mr. Powell went to Spaldings "to follow the trade" and stayed there for a little more than a year. He came back to Bull-Savan nah in 1930. He never went aborad. In spaldings he was working as a shoemaker.

James Powell also sells in the shop. "It's both of we doing the business." I asked which is an better shop or shoemaking. "The one help the other, both not bad at all". He regards however cultivations as his main basis of maintenance. "Whatever you do here in Bull-Savannah you have to cultivate, the main importance from cultivations."

He would like to go to America on contract: "You can earn good money and it is the experience, I would go, but it's hard to get the ticket."

Other children are by his present wife who had 5 children for him, 3 alive and living with the parents.
Rose Powell is daughter of Michael and Margaret Powell, in Green Olive. She has 4 full brothers: Samuel, KRYKYX Eustace, Louie and Lodrick / all in Green Olive/, 5 full sisters: Icy Dyer in Dunder Hill; Ida Rer Ford, Ridge; Zellavine Powell, U.S.A.; Muriel Powell and Cisline Powell, Green Olive. And 2 half brothers: Esban AnxGrann StivaxxwaxlinaxiwxStorma Powell andxWinnx in Green Cl ive and Vian Powell in Comma Pen. Adelaide Simpson: father Gussy Simpson, mother Agnes Simpson, in Rose Hall. Her parents and 2 brothers and 2 sisters live in Rose Hall. Boysie Roach is from Ridge, son of Michael Roach and Ida Roach. Miskinskinskaxkinkthankingarxxxxxxxxxxx Has 5 brothers and 4 sisters.

Tomaroes: 3000 holes, L15. Crop failed. 50 yam hills. 1/2 acre caesava. 1/2 acre com. 3/4 acre congo.1/4 ac. red 1 donkey, 4 goats, 2 hens, 9 chickens. James Powell is shoemaker, earns 10/- from his trade. Rose works in the factory in the season. Earned to L6 in this season /in 3 months time/. Reckly spendings: 50/-. L20 was spent on clothes for the household last year. 12 on med. treatm. James spent 20/in the last year on books from W.B.T. Society /Jeh. Witn. publ. /. and L3 on travelling to J.W. conventions.
