Allan Sinclair or Senior? His wife, and here land and her parents

Senior

Allan Senior. His ancestry. Dudley is not certain of Allan's family name. It is either Sinclair or Senior. He thinks that it is Senior, but the man is called Sinclair by his wife's name, who is Sinclair and to whom belongs the place.

"Allan Sinclair wife father was Thomas Sinclair. Allan Sinclair wife is Mottan Sinclair. Mottan got her land from her father Thomas Sinclair. Allan Sinclair had no land. He marry to Modan Sinclair and live in wife his wife home."

Old Thomas Sinclair is brother to old James Sinclair, described as the "old Patriarch" /the oldest man in Ribbit Town/. There was waste stull another brother: Hammon. Hammon and Thomas Sinclair died, only James Sinclair is still alive.

There is no doubt about Allan - he is Allan Senior, not Sinclair. His wife is Sinclair. She is known under nickname "Moddan" Sinclair. The land belongs to her and probably owing to this Allan Senior is sometimes described as Sinclair. But he is Senior.

Allan's father was James Senior. His mother is Florence Rochester, "she was Mr. Laban's bastard sister". Florence's mother was Eliza Salmon, her father was old Thomas Rochester.

Florence Rochester is still alive, though she is mid over 70. She is liwing with her next son, David Powell, son of "Boggy" Powedl, krathar late brother of Michael Powell. So Allan Senior is brother of David Powell, but only by mother.

Florence Rochester had no other children. Ohly

Allan's mother "she is living with David Powell. She is mother of David Powell. Allan Senior and David Powell them is two brother: one mother but different father."

Some time ago FiskensexRochexte Allan Senior lived with his mother. But since he married he stays with his wife and his mother lives in David Powell's home.

The House .

It is one roomed building made of spanish wall and a thatched roof and concreted floor. Inside there are about four chairs, two tableswith glass wares and

photographs of Rebecca's children, wx and grand children. Thereare also photographs of some of her children's friends. On a barrel at one side of the room there is a box covered with a towel. On the box is a suit case, and another box upon the suit case. A stick is stretched across the top of the room, and over the stick there are some clothes hanging.

The beds were outside "airing with all the bed clothes". Rebecca told me "you caan come in because the place dont tidy up yet. When it tidy now you find in a the house cool "The whole room was k clean and the floor very shine, the chairs too were shine. On the walls there are one or two pictures. The house is the home of her old parents. It was smaller, but she has made it a little bigger. Then she can she will put on enother room to it, "but me no have the money yet".

The kitchen .

The walls are of wattle made from sticks and not bamboo, with coconut leaves covering the m waltles. The roof is thatched.

Rebacca does not work for any one now, "me only help me husband cultivate" . When she was much younger she used to do domestic's work "up and down ". Later one she traded one barray. She has stopped her trading now for after we can get the cassava as before ". She plant escallion too, and is able to sell sometimes tor t gwt of it. The price sometimes is 8/- or 10/2- per cut. he does not cultivate a large portion of escallion. Her husband is a cultivator, cultivating at home and in the woods.

In the woods he works on partnership with Septy Holness. At home he plants corn and peas and tomato. Her husband has a very large field of peas at home, and also corn, but she does not at think the corn will give a good crop again because "them want more rain". Her husband plants cassava, yams and potato in the woods, but she could not tell the exact amount of what he plants

Land .

The land she is living on was left by her parents for her. The x parents left seven acres to be divided among the children all. From the seven acres she got two arres. It was measured off by Norman Holness. Her husband cultivates on her land.

She grew with her mother and father. She started to work when she was very young. he did not go to school. "That time parents no did bother bout school as now, even if you did wantgo, them never bother fe sen' you". She went to Mandeveille to seek work. She got a job to do domestic's work with Thompson Lee at 2 16/- per month After working a for three months she became friend with Thompson and got pregnant for him. She had to come home.

quarrelled with her saying "kan that me no did have any right fe make that happen to me ". Her parents did not trun her out, but allow her to stay in the house. The time for delivery came and she had twins for the first. The father cared them well, "and them never in want a any thing. Him come to visit me to ". When her parents saw how k well Thompson cared the babies k their wrath

was changed to peace. They said "out a all the sister h them she do the best, for whe look fe some body way good, and can mine me and the pickmey them. Rebeces was so well cared for that she could help her sisters, her mother and her father.

She and Thompson were not living together for any long tiem, visits were paid by both of them to each other. She again become pregnant for Thompson and ther she had Etta. The twins an are Myrtle and Merlym. She had another one for Thompson, but that child is dead.

She worked next with one Mrs Hylton who was in America. Mrs Hylton had a baby, and took the baby out to leave with her mother Alice Beans who was living at Brownsville. She had to do nursing and domestic's work at 17/- per month. She worked for 6 months with them then she went to work with Mrs Campbell at M Ridge who was living/xikk Mr Thomas Roach' home at the same 17/- per month.

After working for five months she went home. She stayed at home for a while and then went out again to work with Belle Miller at St. Marys District, at 15/- per menth staying kness there for one year and six month The last place she worked was with Mr Leggard at Mande-ville at 5/- per week. Her lodging was not to suit so she did not stay more than a week there.

She and Allan became friends and then Allan came to live at her house. They/arxxx living together for 16 years, and were married six years and ago.

Her children .

They grew with her until thefather took them and sent them to school at Salmon Town. Etta stayed with her the longest, wh went to school at Bull Savannah and after we went to her father. "The father board them wit with a lady at Salmon Town and make them go to school." After they left school they were selling "in a shop a Kingston and Mandevikle". Myrtle has married"a man by the name of Morgan who have a restaurant and bar at Spanish Town". Myrtle has a baby.

Merlyn and Etta are living in Mandeville by themselves. They are not working at present. Merlyn has a
baby, but Rebeccax did not say who is the father. "me
only wish all a them could a make haste married and settl
down, then me wey feel contented". Sometimes her childre
come to look for her, and sometimes they send any littl
thing for her, but me can look to them too much, for
them dey have fe them children ".

Rebecca is proud of her children. Sometimes the -ee goes to visit them staying weeks with them. She was with Myrtle last year, and she is expecting KRR Myrtle to come and visit her in August.

The land was inherited by his wife from her fither thomas Sinclair who is now dead. It consists of 2 acres and is at present fully cultivated save for a space of about & acre, which has been left for the cultivation of tomatoes during the coming season. Crops in cultivation are: yams, corn, cassava, and congo peas.

Family History

His mother Florence Rochester lives in Green Olive, but his father James Sinclair died about 3 years ago. Allin is the olny child to his father and mother.

His mother had one child by another union; this child is David Powell; she is shaping house with David.

His father had by 4 other unions 5 children; they are:

1. Cecil Sinclair, a tailor; he lives "Over the Rd".
2. Jim Sinclair; he lives in Manchester.

School

He began attending the Bull Savannah school when he was 7, but did not remain in school for the entire number of his school years because -"Time get hard. Mi read till mi reach 2nd book, an sh' (his mother) have to tek mi away an' sen' mi to work." He was about 10 when he began to work: -"Sh' sen' mi away to Manchester to employ with a gentleman name' Alec Martin. Sh' saw that gent at Alligator Pond. Sh' usual' to carry vegetables like 'skellion to the sea beach. to sell. The gentleman ask her to get somebody to work with him." She told Martin she had one son which she would let have. Martin agree to take him.

With Mr. Martin in Manchester

Allan was not very upset about having to leave home. He journed to Manchester on a mule drawn cart. In Manchester Mr. M. treated him well --- "Feed an' clothes mi, an' give mi money"-packet money.

His duties atth Mr. M's.

"I was a shaphend boy." Mr. M had about 100 shee He had to drive the sheep from their pens in the mornings, into the grazing grounds, and in the evenings, drive them back into their pens. He liked to do that.

"A was there a good limit o' year, but a can't exactly tell y'u how long." Mr. Martin did live some years, an' then him took sick die, an' after that I leave." He does not know how old he was then. While with Mr. Martin, he had been allowed to come here on occasional visits to his mother.

Meeting his first girl:

Muriel Robinson, mother to his first child Arnold, was his first girl friend. He met her in Manchester, where Arnold was born.

The meeting: "A usual' go to the post office y'u know, an' wi have wi little talk. She was then sharing house with her aunt. He had used to visit her at her aunts. Her aunt had never objected to these visits.

Attitude to his first child: "The child come here when he was a baby: a took her away as a was leaving Manchester. It would be hard for me to send something so far, so have to take away the baby with me so I can get to support him."

On the child's arrival, it was taken over by his mother. She was aided in its care by his aunt -one of his mother's sisters.

His present wife: the meeting:

"A meet her right in the home here." Her mother was alive then. "A never need to write her because the 2 of gs did live close to each other.

"A married in 1941." He had met his wife -"A good which before." He does not remember how long before. They shared house before the married and had one child -Embla. (Embla is 5; Allan must therefore have married after 1941)
