Family History

His father Panton Schloss "die in Guba" before he was boon. His mother Matilda Achkasa Holness, died when je was 3 years old. Children to Panton and Matilda im Herbert Schloss (informant) and Ucal Schloss. died when he was a baby I week old.

His father had no other children.

His mother had by another union Harold Wint, son to Marakaxwintxx Ferdinand Wint. Harlod is living in Old Harhour. Hubert has written to him twide but has not had a reply.

His mother's mother was Adeliade Chambers. His mother's father Charles Holness. They had 4 children, 4 of which are alive. hese are:
