## Land

Samuel owns 7 adres. He inherited it from his father. His father bought the land from Perkins. Charles (his father) also owned 50 acres of land "in the wood part." That land don't share up yet. All of we work it. Any where you feel to make a groun', you a make it and no disturbance in the work." A road was cut through Samuel land about 6 years ago and he has not been able to get pay for it. "Still have to pay the same amount of taxes" Eglon Rochester wrote a letter concerning the payment of land which was used up for the road. 2" everybody sign it and him give it to Mr. Sangster."

### House

Samuel's first house was blown down by the storm. "And I build another one." Samuel has been living on this land long before his father died. He does not know the cost of the house. "Never under no siphering, but it cost whole heap of money."

### Early days

When Samuelwas a child lots of horses, cows and pigs were reared. "That's all they use to do. Them was making out well, for them time things was cheap. When them carry 10/- go a shop, it want jackass to carry home the things. Now 10/- can't buy a kerchief. Them time

when you have a pound (£1) is a whole month's spending, and it can't done. Saltfish was 3d a lb, not even 3d for them just cut it give you; now is 1/-."

## Fishing.

Sam. was a fisherman. "Fishing pay plenty, but malaria fever worry me and I have to give it up. When fish don't sell we just give it away, not like now them can't e en catch enough to sell. You noh hear them say that in the later days, fish will be as wise as man." Asked him to tell me of his life on the sea. "Nothing more than me catch plaf the fish and make plenty money. I meet good life in it." Owing to sickness "and other things" Samuel had to use up his money.

## Cuba days.

Sam. spent 10 years in Cuba. "Work at mill, cut cane, weed grass, work in kitchen, all them kind of ways."
He met his son's mother Winnifred Connel in Cuba. She is originally from Montego Bay. Winnifred and himself worked at the same place. "She was cleaning and I was cooking, and as man all over, you know, I must say something." Very few cubans live in concubinage, it is mostly found among the Jamaicans. Sam loved Winnifred but he did not want to be married in Cuba, so they lived together. "Since we was expecting to come out me wever want to marry in another man land." Winnie and Sam still lived together when they came home to Jamaica. His son Freddie who is now 13, was born here.

Winnifred died in child's birth. "As him deliver the baby him dead. Cost me plenty money. Them time not like now when you have a doctor in the district. You have to send to Black River and Mandeville before you could get a doctor." The baby lived for 3 months. "Don't think a little money it cost to bring up a baby for that time that don't know him mother. Hive to buy all kind of things for it." Sam's sister looked after the child.

### Marriage.

If Winnifred were alive perhaps Sam would be married.
"But I don't want take/woman child and make them suffer.
Have to have money first. Not thousands of pounds,
but a little money." Have showed me some lumber in the
yard. "See I just getting out lumber to a put up a
better house. The house he has now is not good enough
for any woman he may marry.

Sam. was in a hurry and a wanted to go off to the factory for water. He said. "Well you have to cut your argument short, as I want to run off here for a little water." He suggested that I call on Eli Perkins.

Samuel has two children, one before he went to Cuba and the other since he has returned. His first child is Crofton Brooks by "Judida" from Top ull Savannah. e does not remember "Judida's" Surname. Judida still lives at Top ull Savannah. Samuel used to support Crofton "but him a big man k now so me stop".

Ferdie's mother is dead . Ferdieks was staying in Mingston with one of his aunts, his mother's sister (Samuel does not remember the aunt's name) but he came home after he was there for two years . "him no did like the town ". He sends Ferdie to school, but "him won' go, him hide a bush when me sen him. But him though sorry when him grow big, for me sorry now ".

Is the daughter of Erofton and Majorie Banton . Majorie gave the child to rofton, and Crofton who is unable to care the child, asked the father to take it to stay along with him The child he has been staying with Samuel for about two years. Samuel has to support and care the child in every way. Held has to comb the child's hair, and he has to give the her clothes at no some one to wash. "A woman work fe comb him hair, but if them carr' him come give me and me he no have any woman me no mus' do it me self".

"Me and them cook the food, and sometime him cook too.
You see him dey him caan cook any thing you give him fe cook".
Samuel was going away to look for his stock in the bushes, so he said "you tax caan come back one 'nother day, but me caan stop any longer with you to day". "ithx/that he went out and started off for the direction in which his animals were.
