INTERVIEW WOTH MAUD JOHNSON.

Mrs. Maud Johnson was born in Top Bull Savannah on the premises not occupied by her brother Charles Lewis. She is "about 52." Her Husband Charles Johnson died about 18 years ago.

Present Household

Her household consists of herself and Hardy Simpson a boy of about 8 whom she has adopted a son. Harvey's father Murell Simpson died about 2 years ago. His mother Mrs. Linette Simpson lives in op Bull Savannah towards Ridger Checolate Hole.

Miss Maud adopted Harvey about 2 years ago, because "him is the same family, an' as him fatherdie."

Her house and land

Her house was build by her husband before he died. It stands on about $2\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land. She plants on it tomatoes pigeon and cungo peas and and cassava. She does not know what acerage these cathagenxonemax crops occupy.

She hires labour: She hires somebody to the do the planting. The hired man is a fellow named Astley. She does not know Astley's surname; he lives in Thatch Walk. She pays him 3/per day, when he works for her. Sometimes she employs other people -among them a fellow named Massa. Massa is from Clarendon. -"The district people them mank mostly do them own work; y'u hardly get them to work with y'u. Massa is now kink sharing hosue with a girl named Linette Miller. They live in Thatch Walk.

The land was bought by her husband. She is paying the taxes for it.

Her child

She had bykh her husband one child: -Issac Johnson. Issac had married kand Marrion Roach a daughter of Thomas Roach of Ridge, Bull Savannah. That was 11 years ago. He lives with his wife in a 4 apartment house built 10 years ago on her land. Before he had built the house and came to live in it, he used to king share house with his wife's father.

Family H, story

Miss Maud's mother was Miss Francis Simpson; her

father Charles Lewis. Her mother had with her father 8 children. Three of these are alive. They 1. Mrs. Maud Johnen *** (informant) 2. Charles Lewis of T.B.S.

3. Mrs. Sarah Holness of Commer Pen.

Charles and Francis left some land after their death. Charles her brother is now living on the old home site. The remainder of the land is an 8 acre plot in Breadnut woods. This land is not shared up between the children yet alive; it is used in parts by each as there is need. Said she -"Everybody work on it. Taxes for it is paid in Charles' name. The land is registered in his mame. When tax time comes round she gives without being asked from four to six shillings.towards payment; she added -"All like mi noh have husban' sometime mi noh give anything at Does not Mr. Charles quarrel when you don't manage to give anything? -"No, sometime him have to give mi some thing instead of quarreling."

Mrs. Holness her sister pays her portion of the taxes regularly. Miss Maud does not know how much is paid by her sister.

Family intercourse

She goes to, and Mrs. Holness comes to see her sometimes. - "When sickness wi visit one another often." When she goes to see Mrs. Holness she usually takes "fish when abx can get it, an' fruits like sweetsop, watermellon and paw-paw.

When her sister comes to vistis her she usually brings xxxx some breadfruit, nazeberries and some robin mangoes.

Mrs. Holness also goes tog see Charles. She takes him presents of foodstuff. Mx.

Mr. Charles eemds her presents of foodstuff like yams, sweet potatoes, etc. without her asking for He does that frequently, but not quite every week. She visits him at his house and he at hers.

Her appearance

Miss Maud is a woman of very large proportions. She has a jolly, friendly, disposition. She was wearing black shoes, a red-stripped head-kerchief, on her head, a a blue and white stripped dress, -coton dress,

The interview was given in the kitchen where she was cooking lunch, and in was in a hurry because she feared Harvey wouldechinchormnstabed beforeeshpetatees casesvaferhad, with cooked pickled mackerel, in coconut oil. The cassava was cooked in an mx iron pot over an open fore which blazed merrily whiel wetalked. The wood used to keep the blaze going is candlewood.

The kitchen

On this firewall were a bammy baking iron about 15 inches (40 c.m.) in diameter, and whenk 4 dutch pots the lagrest being about 15 inches in diameter and about 5 inches deep -13 c.m. On a table standing against one wall of the building waxx were a waxden pail of water, and an enamel-ware pot of about 8 quart capacity. The table measured about 4feet by 3feet. (1 meter 22 cem. by 1 meter.)

Miss Maud lives in a two apartment house. I did not see into the interior of this. There is another building of about the same size as the house. She now uses it as a storehouse. She once used to use it as a bakery: that was when she used to bake. She will give me the story of her baking another time.
