Mechanism of
immigration.

Bromfield like some other men in Tad Town /Stephenson, Sailsman/ is an immigrant to this district. The way he settled here is similar to the other cases.

"Bromfield David is from Ballards Valley. He met the girl Rebecca Ebanks, daughter of old Charles Ebanks and Rachel banks. David Bromfield didn't have a home of his own, he marry Rebecca Ebanks and live in Rebecca Ebanks father and mother home."

"Rebecca Ebanks was the last girl - so it happened that she succeeded the old parents home."

"Right now they are still living in the old parents home and have lots of pickeny."

The land.

"The land they have - succeeded from father /of Rebecca/. They have land in the wood parts and lot of land right in the home. Bromfield Wife have the landline on Charles Lewis land in the woods. Charles Lewis bought land from Rebecca Ebanks."

Wife's occupation.

"Rebecca Ebanks mother was the midwife in Tad Town. Right now Rebecca can do a little /midwifery/. Doesn't bring much - a little."

Their children:

1. "Arthy - he is over 18. He is a cultivator. No other occupation. No girl-friend."

2. "Eddy - working along with him father."

3. "Marjorie /Maudry/ She is living now in Mr. Cornelius Elliott home just over there. She is working as a maid and she is to call Cornelius wife 'aunt.'"

4. "Errold - still small boy - still with father and mother."

5,6,7,8, "Frederick - going to school. Canute, Rachel Iris - small children."

9. "One dead - one little girl. She was swelling. I saw her at the doctor. Small little baby, died 2 years aback. She was around one year and six months."

Altaman Ebanks,
Rebecca's brother.

Altaman Ebanks is another ~~member~~ member of this family. He is son of Charlie Ebanks and brother of Rebecca /cf. Fam.Rec.238/. His mother was Rebecca Roy. Old Altaman Ebanks is still alive, still living in David Bromfield's home.

He has no children and no wife. Is described as "not so normal; speak good, but just cant rule himself. We call him Kleb."

Julius and Charles
Lewis, sons of Rebecca's sister.

Besides Altaman Ebanks, brother of Rebecca, two other members of her family were living in her home: Julius and Charles Lewis, sons of her sister ~~Alice~~ Alice Ebanks. The same Alice was mother to Alva Samuels. Julius died 3 years ago, Charles is still living in his aunt's home.

"Julius - he was son of Alice Ebanks, who was the mother of Alva Samuels. That boy father /i.e. Julius' father/ wasnt a Jamaican. He was working on ship - come to Jamaica. Dont get his father name, but he was not Lewis". Julius ~~is~~ is no more alive.

"He was having T.B. like Alva Samuels. He died around 3 years ago - not suddenly, slowly. He was a fisherman, take the cold down the Alligator Pond and it develop."

"Charles - we call him "Beder" - he is Julius brother, by the same man that was the father of Julius, a sailor from Kingston." ~~He is living still with his aunt and belongs to this household.~~

McDonald Joyce,
adopted daughter.

"Joyce, the little ~~girl~~ girl as for Horace McDonald - he is the father. But how it happen? Hilda Francis who was Horace McDonald wife, in travelling she die - she was delivering two baby and she die. So at the time Rebecca Bromfield she didnt have a little baby at the time. So she took the little baby that the mother left. ~~The mother's baby~~ Laura Powell, Horace McDonald sister /now she marry to Samuel Powell/ took another baby."

Occupations.

Bromfield David is a cultivator - he "dont ~~fix~~ fish". "Him dont have any other trade. Do a little ~~rais~~ raising: cows, and sheep and pigs and goats. Him have a mother cow now, a few sheep, around 5, around 5 goats - two ewe in them. Pigs - dont know how many, 1 or 2. You cant raise much pigs."

David Bromfield: son of Alfred Bromfield and Ann Bromfield /first Rhoden/. He was born in Ballard's Valley where his parents lived. All his brothers and sisters live in Ballard's Valley: They are: Leonard, Alfred, Charles and Eva. Dead ones: Alexander, Leon, Egbert.

Rebecca Bromfield: daughter of Charles and Rachel Ebanks. Her mother's maiden name was Neil. Her brothers and sisters: full brothers: Percival, Shirley and Julius Ebanks. Half siblings: Altaman Ebanks and Charles Ebanks /same father/, Alice Lewis /dead/ and Ellen Elliott /wife of Cornelius Elliott in B.B.S./ - same mother.

Marriage, children. David and Rebecca married in 1925. They had 10 children, 9 alive. 7 children stay with them. 19 years old Madric Bromfield is adopted by Ellen Elliott, living with his ad. mother in B.B.S. 13 years old Cedric Bromfield is adopted by Laura Powell in Tad Town and living with her.

Altaman ~~Bromfield~~ Ebanks is son of Charles Ebanks and Rebecca Roye.

McDonald Joyce is daughter of Hilda, who was sister of Rebecca's mother. She was Neil, married a McDonald Harris in Tad Town, then died. Her daughter is adopted by David and Rebecca, her aunt.
