In March we hosted a group of friends, called the Pahiatua Girls who brought along their family and friends. Thank you for a great day at the museum. We appreciate the generosity of the donors, both monetary and also for the beautiful selection of objects that were received on the day. Thank you

New table display, Memories to Memoirs, Memoirs written by Poles who, as an outcome of WWII, came to New Zealand. We have on display published books, articles, photo albums, and typed life stories. We will continue to collect people memoirs (written or oral) if you will be interested to share with others, let us know.

1st of July has seen Poland taking the Presidency of the Council of the European Union. This honour will last till the end of 2011. Poland is the only country in the EU to have positive economic growth during the recent recession.

The 60th anniversary of World Refugee Day was celebrated on June 19th in Mangere Auckland, the 733 Children of Pahiatua were remembered as the first refugee group to be invited to New Zealand by the then Prime Minister Peter Fraser, 67 years ago. PHTM was invited to attend this event and with the Auckland Polish Assn put together two large and colourful displays which were admired by all.

Students visit the museum

Over 2 weeks in July, 9 classrooms of students from Cockle Bay Primary School enjoyed a visit to the museum, each visit was based on the book "Stefania's dancing slippers" with a DVD presentation of the story, complemented with black and white original photographs of the period 1939-1949. Students also learned about Poland and its cultural diversity, learning to say Witamy and Dzien dobry and experienced a traditional bread and salt welcome.
