and their families celebrating their 67th reunion

On the 1st of November 1944, 733 children and 102 caregivers arrived in Wellington on the ship the General Randall. Later that day the children travelled by train to Pahiatua, to their first home in New Zealand

Recent Donation from Howick local Mr Arnie Rule Here is his story...

"I was a member of the All Saints Boy Scout group in Palmerston North. At a scout meeting we were told of a group of Polish children arriving by train to escape the horrors of WW2. It was thought that it would be a nice aesture to meet the train and welcome the children to New Zealand.

I remember going into the carriage and passing an autograph book to the children for signatures. Language was a problem so sign language was the only way of communication. There was lots of laughter but unfortunately the stop over was fairly short and they were soon on their way to Pahiatua.

The experience was something that has remained with me for all my life. I was thirteen years old at the time and am delighted that this autograph book is of some interest to the Polish Heritage Trust Museum."
