

Painted Wooden Plate Museum collection

A wonderful donation was received from Heather in Auckland. A **painted wooden plate**, which was most likely made/decorated at the Polish Children's camp sometime be-



tween 1944 -1949. On the back, the words in ink "High School Polish Camp". Heather says she found the plate in a second hand shop some 40 years ago and really loved it, she has kept it as a decoration in her home all these years. She decided to donate it to PHTM this year to "bring it back home to its Polish heritage" What was surprising for us is that we have in the museum collection, a plate with the same design but a different colour way so we are wondering, are there more of them in NZ. Did you have a plate painting class at the camp? The other plate was shown in the July 2011 newsletter.

Wooden Goblet Museum collection

Also this year a significant and beautiful donation, a Wooden goblet from Siberia with floral motif in black, red and dark green. On the base, a stamp written in Russian.

Mrs K Kolodynska-Downey, writes "When my mother and I were in Siberia (1940 - 1942) there were so called "shops" in the village where we were, but the shelves were empty. From time to time a queue would form outside the shop because it was rumoured that something would be sold there. It could be anything or nothing! On one occasion my mother joined a queue and came home with this wooden goblet as there was nothing else left to buy..."

Thank you for this special and very precious item. It will be treasured and kept with other memorabilia, reminding us of the forced journey of 1.7 million Poles who were sent to Siberia during WW2.

Wycinanki



Celebrating Wigilia



Here is a recipe, one of the 12 traditional dishes served at that meal. Please enjoy.

'Christmas Eve mushroom soup is made without meat stock just like the Christmas Eve Borsch (beetroot soup) It is not meant to fill the stomach but to merely warm it and awaken the appetite, It is made in the following way:

Pour 3.5 pints lukewarm water over 3oz dried boletus mushrooms and cook covered over a low heat. When the mushrooms soften add a fair amount of vegetables (celeriac, parsley root, carrots, leeks & onion) and 10 peppercorns, cook 30 minutes. Strain the soup through a very fine sieve, salt to taste and if desired add some lemon juice.

Add cooked mushroom caps, sliced into thin strips and lazanki (a kind of noodle) which have been cooked separately'
