### Polish Heritage Trust Museum

**1st 1920 Battle of Warsaw**, 110 min. English subtitles. This great historical movie directed by Jerzy Hoffman on one of the most important battles in world history. This battle maintained a newly regained Poland's independence for 19 years and halted the Red Army march on Europe, forcing Lenin and Trotsky to resign for lighting the "flame of the world revolution".

**8th Man of Marble** by Andrzej Wajda, 156min, English subtitles. Agnieszka, a film school student is making her diploma film on bricklayer, Mateusz Birkut who becomes the symbol of an over-achieving worker. She is looking for the truth about Birkut life story, as an outcome she has discovered the truth about hypocritical social-realism system which has been introduced to Poland after WWII by Soviet Russia.

**15th Man of Iron** by Andrzej Wajda, 147min, English subtitles. Maciej is a young worker involved in the anti-Communist labour Solidarity movement, described as "the man who started the Gdansk shipyard strike". A journalist working for the Communist regime's radio station is given a task of slandering Maciej. Maciej is clearly intended as a parallel to Lech Walesa (who appears as himself in the movie). The film is a continuation of the story of Maciej Tomczyk, the son of the Mateusz Birkut the main character of Wajda's earlier film "Man of Marble",
